LAUREL AND CHAPARRAL VILLAGE





CAMPUS LIVING VILLAGES

Campus Living Villages (CLV), a privately owned company, owns and operates both Chisholm Hall and University Oaks pursuant to a long-term ground lease with the university. A student choosing one of these options is contracting with a private company (CLV), not the university. Residents of these two properties are not required to purchase meal plans.

CHISHOLM HALL

Chisholm Hall houses 509 students in a traditional residence hall style. Students may choose a double-occupancy room or private room. All rooms have private bathrooms. Chisholm Hall is immediately adjacent to the Roadrunner Café.



UNIVERSITY OAKS






CHISHOLM: DOUBLE OCCUPANCY, 365 SQ. FT.



Our academic coaches assist students through programs such as supplemental instruction and free tutoring to ensure you achieve your educational goals.

COLLEGES' FRESHMAN ADVISING CENTER

Though you have a declared major, you may still have many questions. You might be wondering, "How do I know which business class I should take?" or "What prerequisites do I need before next year?" Don't worry—we'll guide you in the right direction.

LEARNING COMMUNITIES & FRESHMAN SEMINAR

The Learning Communities Program helps ease the transition to college. In the fall, first-year students are enrolled in two or three core curriculum classes with the same group of 25 students. Every student in the program will be enrolled in Freshman Seminar, a 3-credit-hour course designed to provide first-year students

with study skills and to ease the transition from high school to college.

LIBRARIES

Imagine having access to a newly renovated library, personalized research assistance, and more than half a million books to complete your class projects. Our reference librarians are available to answer your questions in person or via email, text and IM. UTSA offers an innovative partnership with the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio to facilitate study for students seeking medical degrees. We'll also provide assistance with the application processes for medical and dental school.

PRE-LAW PROGRAM

Created as a partnership between UTSA and The University of Texas School of Law, the Institute for Law and Public Affairs (ILPA) prepares upper-level undergraduates for law school or careers in public affairs. APPLYING TO UTSA FRESHMAN

REQUIREMENTS

Admissions requirements have been designed to identify students who are academically prepared to be successful at UTSA. Offers of admission are valid only for the semester for which the application is submitted.

All students must meet either the school program/curriculum requirements or the SAT/ACT College Readiness Benchmarks of the state's Uniform Admissions Policy.

SAT or ACT scores are not used to determine admission of applicants ranked in the top 25% of their class, but they must be submitted. Students considered by Committee Review must meet the stated minimum SAT or ACT requirements.

HOW TO APPLY

1. Apply online at applytexas.org.
2. Pay an application fee of \$60 (starting in Fall 2013).
3. Submit your official high school transcript.
4. Send your ACT/SAT scores directly from the testing agency:

5. If you took college credit courses, send final official college transcript when available (not required for admission decision).
6. If you are graduating early from high school, submit a recommendation letter from your guidance counselor.
7. All required documents must be received by the Admissions Office prior to Committee Review.
8. An admissions decision will not be made until all required documents are received.

You are a Freshman Transfer if you have 1-29 completed transferable hours from a regionally accredited institution at the time of application (work in progress is not considered).

- Must meet the same Guaranteed Admission requirements as first-time freshman (outlined on opposite page)
- Request ACT/SAT scores be sent directly from the testing agency
- Have at least a cumulative 2.25 GPA on a 4.0 scale in all transferable college coursework from a regionally accredited institution
- Be eligible to return to the most recently attended institution (includes academic and disciplinary actions)*

Transfer (30+ hrs)

You are a Transfer if you have 30 or more completed transferable hours from a regionally accredited institution at the time of application (work in progress is not considered).

- Have at least a cumulative 2.25 GPA on a 4.0 scale in all transferable college coursework from a regionally accredited institution
- Be eligible to return to the most recently attended institution (includes academic and disciplinary actions)*

REQUIREMENTS

Freshman Admission

Freshman applicants graduating from a foreign high school must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.75 out of 4.0. Freshman applicants graduating from a U.S. high school, an American school in a foreign country, or a high school in a native English-speaking country must submit SAT (sat.org) or ACT (act.org) scores.

Transfer Admission

Applicants transferring from a foreign college/university must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.75 out of 4.0. Applicants transferring from a U.S. college/university must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.25 out of 4.0. Applicants with fewer than 30 semester hours of academic credit earned at the time of applying must also submit the freshman requirements.

Conditional Admission

Conditional admission is a program for international undergraduate students who meet our academic requirement but who do not meet our TOEFL or IELTS score requirement. Students eligible for conditional admission will first enter the UTSA Intensive English Program (IEP) for at least one semester until the required TOEFL or IELTS score is achieved. Conditional admission is not available for majors under the College of Architecture.

2. Pay an application fee of \$60 (starting in Fall 2013).
3. If you are applying as a freshman, submit your official high school transcript.
4. If you are applying as a transfer, submit an official transcript from each college/university attended and submit a foreign credential evaluation of your foreign college/university transcripts. We recommend Foreign Credential Services of America (FCSA): www.fcsa.biz.
5. Submit an official English translation for non-English transcripts.
6. Send your ACT/SAT scores directly from the testing agency:

7. Submit your TOEFL or IELTS scores directly from the testing agency.

APPLYING TO UTSA MORE INFORMATION

COLLEGE-SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

Several academic areas at UTSA have set standards beyond the university's general admission criteria that must be met to qualify for the chosen major. Those academic areas currently include the College of Architecture, College of Business, College of Engineering, Department of Biology, Department of Communication, and Department of Health and Kinesiology. Students who are admitted to UTSA and who wish to enroll in those colleges or departments but do not yet meet the criteria will undertake coursework to meet additional requirements to qualify for the chosen major before being admitted to the program.

HONORS COLLEGE REQUIREMENTS

Admission to the Honors College is competitive and based on GPA, ACT or SAT scores, an essay and recommendations. To be eligible to apply to the Honors College, first-time freshmen should expect to graduate in the top 10 percent of their class and have a composite SAT critical reading and math score of 1200 or higher or a composite ACT of 27 or higher. Students who meet only the rank or test score requirement may also apply to be considered on a case-by-case basis.

UTSA'S FAFSA CODE 010115

Financial aid consists of federal, state and institutional funds such as grants, loans, work-study and scholarships. To apply for these funds, you must complete the online Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the applicable aid year. This must be done each year. UTSA's federal school code is 010115.

The priority deadline to submit your FAFSA for fall applicants is March 15. Typically, grants are awarded first-come, first-served based on the date of a valid (non-rejected) FAFSA submission. Students must be admitted to UTSA to be given a financial aid award. Financial aid is typically awarded for the fall and spring semesters.

We have developed a Financial Aid Outreach program in which financial aid representatives work directly with students and parents to educate them on the affordability of UTSA. Topics and services include financial aid overviews and workshops on how to complete the FAFSA. Visit the Outreach link on our website for a calendar of events in your area. Presentations are offered in English and Spanish.




